Lessons from PH Energy Champions' Programme



# You're A Champ – Key Objectives

To encourage local people to volunteer in a project that addresses fuel poverty in a sustainable way.

To enable local people to connect and work with each other to solve a common problem.

To train staff/volunteers to carry out home visits, follow up advice combining installation of physical measures, energy & income discussion & wider referrals and signposting.

**Energy Champions/Volunteers** 

To develop an innovative and sustainable approach to local engagement around energy by exploring alternative funding options e.g. Solar PV Community Benefit Society (90% of profits channelled back into community)

To offer support and advice to low-income families in Poplar and share practical tips on ways to save energy at home and reduce energy bills.



### **Energy-Saving Tips for the Homes**

15 Advanced ESOL students trained as energy champions

- 273 families provided with energy saving packs delivered at their doors.
- Families who adopted the energy plans saved between £75 and £120 p/a on average.
- 88% of residents tried the energy saving tips and 83% said they would continue to do so.
- 48 families have had smart electricity and gas loops installed enabling families to be more aware of their actual energy usage and are more conscious of adopting energy-saving practices.





### **Energy Best Deal** – with UK Advice Bureau

- Enabled 3 Energy Champions from among the 15 to receive training in facilitating energy saving workshops.
- The interactive workshops reached more local people (1 session a week x 20 participants/week x 8 weeks)
- Participants learned about available government support and how to maximise them.






### Fuelling Connections – with Hubbub

A Facebook Page maintained by designated Energy Champions who uploaded energy saving/well-being tips and encouraged FB users to comment, ask questions and share their own tips.

- active and useful online exchanges facilitated among local people around saving energy as well as reducing waste and recycling
- Connections and links among local people who have found a support network in times of need
- energy Champions gained confidence in communicating with peers and the community at large.






### **LEAP (Local Energy Advice Project)**

With Agility Eco

LEAP is an innovative intervention which integrates energy efficiency into a broader financial and well-being programme.

- 120 families referred to LEAP by our Energy Champions and benefited from the range of services offered
- Support from the Green Doctor and IncomeMax added £6k to one resident's annual income





### **Managing a Community Benefit Society**

A former PH Board member became one of 3 Trustees that formed Geo-Capita, a CBS formed to purchase and install solar panels in 20 PH residential properties. He is joined by 2 PH staff.

The panels generate renewable energy & Income generated is channelled into the CBS to benefit the community.

#### **Outcomes:**

6,500 solar panels have been installed across our estates. The panels have delivered over £36,000 in energy savings for our residents, and are expected to generate £2m value of clean energy over 20 years.





# You're a Champ – Lessons Learned

- Involvement and Champions' Training Enhances language skills of Advanced ESOL Learners
- Residents respond more to Champions who are from the same community as theirs
- Champions get to know their neighbours more and Q & A around energy saving tips and support are good starting points for friendly chats
- Door to door exchanges are more effective than just written materials dropped through letterboxes
- Home visits especially to older people's properties are very welcomed especially by those living on their own





### You're a Champ – Lessons Learned

- Creating opportunities for people to become energy champions at different levels attract a wide range of people who are willing to share their spare time
- Being able to share tips online enables champions to reach more people in a short period of time.
- Knowing that Energy Champions are volunteers and genuinely want to help make people welcome them and listen to their suggestions.
- Volunteers get lots of benefits from being energy champions including: increased knowledge on how to save energy and reduce their own bills, being accredited, improving their CV, gained respect and acceptance in the community and feeling a sense of fulfilment having supported others, etc.
