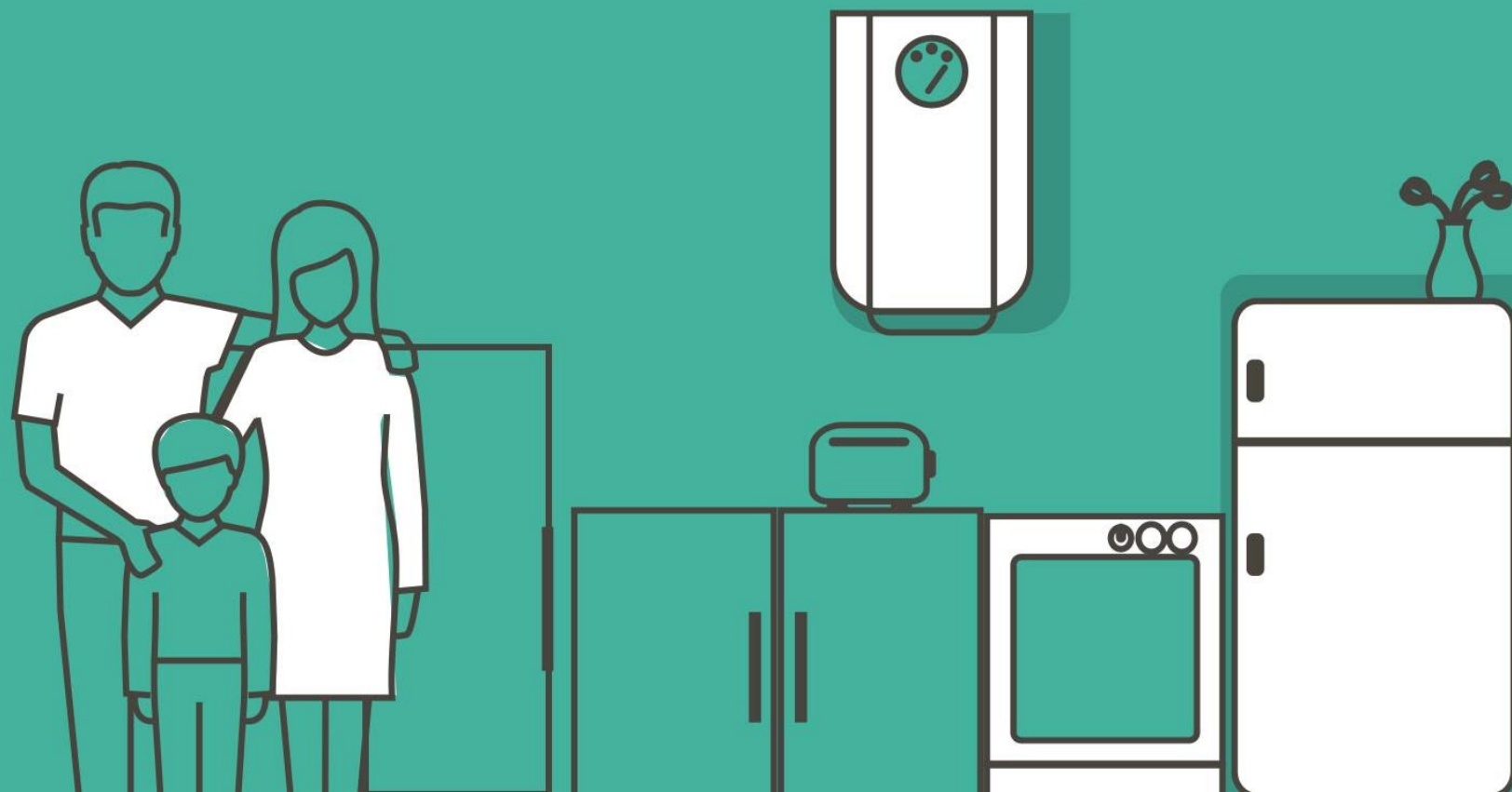

Energy Redress Scheme

- The scheme distributes voluntary payments from Ofgem regulates companies that may have breached rules
- Funding amounts vary as new payments are received
- We review funding on a quarterly basis (Jan, Apr, Jul, Oct)
- Four streams, focused particularly on energy end use:
 - Main Fund
 - Small Fund
 - Innovation Fund
 - Carbon Emissions Reduction Fund (CERF)



Energy Redress update

- Energy Saving Trust were successful at retaining the contract to manage Redress until 2024
- Phase Two Round One is open – £27m
- Open to charitable organisations & exempt Housing Associations in England, Scotland & Wales

	Main Fund	Small Fund
Amount available	£18 million	£1 million
Grant size	£50,000 to £2 million	£20,000 to £49,999



What can Redress fund?

Projects that are within Ofgem's regulatory area

- Can provide capital or revenue funding
- Up to 100% of the project cost (note grant pays quarterly in arrears)
- Projects lasting up to a maximum of 24 months



Energy Redress principles

- Maximise positive impact of Redress funding
 - Cost effective projects with tangible outcomes
 - Due diligence
 - Avoid duplication
 - Encourage collaboration



Example Housing Association Projects

Project	Focus & Fit
Elderpark Housing Association	A partnership of three housing associations, delivering an energy advice service for vulnerable households. The project focuses on tackling fuel debt and reducing household energy consumption through better energy usage.
Southway Housing Trust	Address home energy efficiency by delivering energy advice to Southway tenants and training to staff, to ensure fuel debt is identified and referral pathways are in place.
Hjaltland Housing Association	A retrofit pilot to develop a solution for difficult to treat timber kit properties to bring them up to the insulation standard of the association.
